Mrs. Armon Whittle Gardner Roberts, age 78, died Friday evening in Grenada, Mississippi after a short illness. Funeral services will be held Monday, June 18, 2001 at 11:00 AM in the Chapel of Pafford Funeral Home with Charles Thomason officiating. Interment will follow at Independence Cemetery. She was married to John Melton Gardner on October 11, 1940. She had two children, a son, Johnny LaNeil Gardner, who died at birth and a daughter, Peggy Gardner Usery and two grandsons, Justin Usery of Grenada and Eric Usery of Cabot Arkansas. Mrs. Roberts was a homemaker for many years. She began her career as that of a waitress in 1961. She enjoyed her work very much and loved being around other people. She was a very good cook and enjoyed working in the yard with her flowers. Two years after the death of her husband, John Gardner, in Tennessee she moved to Grenada, Mississippi in August of 1984 to be near her grandsons. She had visited Southside Church of Christ on several occasions during the previous two years. Upon moving to Grenada in 1984 she met Al Roberts of Elliott at church services. Mr. Roberts had lost his wife to death also in 1982. They began a lasting friendship that developed into a lasting love. They married at Southside Church of Christ on April 28, 1985. They enjoyed a full life together with him working as a farmer and her as a housewife. Through the years her health began to take its toll. After several surgeries throughout her life, she began dialysis in May of 1999. Al has been her nurse, housekeeper, and caretaker for the past two years. No one could have had a greater friend, love or
