



John Wyatt "Mr. John" Threadgill

January 30, 1917 - March 17, 2008

Funeral services for John Wyatt "Mr. John" Threadgill, age 91, are scheduled for 2:00PM, Wednesday, March 19, 2008 at First United Methodist Church in Lexington with Rev. John Archer and Rev. Stan McDaniel officiating. Burial will follow in Lexington Cemetery. Pafford Funeral Home in Lexington is in charge of arrangements. Mr. John died early Monday in Jackson. He was born January 30, 1917 in Lexington to the late James "Jim" Washington Threadgill and Ella Mullins Threadgill. He was a pilot with the Air Force during WWII. He was a retired partner with Threadgill Lumber Company and a self made architect who assisted many families with their drawings and home plans, even after retiring. He was the longest sustained member of the First United Methodist Church and President of the Tennessee Taildragers Association. Mr. John was preceded in death by two sisters and three brothers, Coby Threadgill Conger, Helen Threadgill Ross, James E (Czar) Threadgill, Paul Reid Threadgill, and Harold "Dickie" Threadgill. Survivors include his wife of 61 years, Mrs. Jean Middleton Threadgill of Lexington, his son, Steve (Janet) Threadgill of Lexington, his daughter, Pam (Phillip) Threadgill Trella of Nashville, and two grandchildren, Rob McDaniel and Dana Trella Cary.
