



Tommie Faye Meadows

Funeral services for Tommie Faye Teague Meadows, 72, will be held at 2:00pm, Thursday, February 24, 2005 in the chapel of Pafford Funeral Home with Dr. Hoyt Wilson and Bro. Richard Savage officiating. Burial will follow in Lexington Cemetery. Mrs. Meadows died Tuesday, February 22, 2005 at her home in Lexington after a long battle with lung cancer. She lived most of her life in Lexington attending Lexington City School and graduating Lexington High in 1951 and soon after, married her high school sweetheart, John King Meadows, who was in the Air Force. This union of love and affection lasted almost 54 years. She attended West Tennessee Business College and worked most of her career with the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture, Farmers Home Administration retiring 2 years early in 1992, at age 60, with 30 years of federal employment, in order to look after her ailing mother. She was a member of the First Baptist Church, where she taught the 4 year old Sunday School Class for 35 years, until her illness. She was a member of the WMU, Ryanna Dennison Prayer Group, and the JOY (Just Older Youth) Club, where she and John took many bus trips over the past 10 years. She was a life member of VFW Post 1294 Ladies Auxiliary, Woodman of the World Lodge 49, life member of NARFE and a volunteer worker with John at the Heritage Museum. Tommie was the daughter of the late Elmer and Nilar White Teague of Lexington and was preceded in death by one brother, Lynn Teague. She is survived by her husband, John King Meadows, her daughter, Lisa (Eddie) Hester of Lexington, two brothers, Larry and Glynn Teague of Lexington and
