



Mr. Willie F. Scott

April 17, 1924 - August 14, 2012

Graveside services for Willie Franklin Scott-88-will be held at The Ebenezer Cemetery, adjacent to the Ebenezer Methodist Church this Friday, August 17th at 11am in the Reagan, TN community.

Mr. Scott, born April 17, 1924 , the youngest son of Jesse E. Scott and A. Mae Scott was born, raised and educated in the Jackson area. An army volunteer in World War 2 and served with The Big Red 1 where he fought in the European campaign and was wounded in action in Normandy, France following D-Day and following a brief period of recuperation, continued to serve, returned to combat, participating under George Patton in the Battle of the Bulge, the liberation of Paris and later served in the Army of Occupation. His immediate post-war duties in France including protection of the Palace of Versailles. He received numerous honors including two purple hearts and two bronze stars during the conflict.

Mr. Scott worked for over 30 years at Citiplate in Jackson, where he was involved in the manufacture and distribution of lithographic printing plates. A lifelong Democrat and Baptist, Mr. Scott was a member of Parkview Baptist Church in Jackson. He was a proud member of The Military Order of the Purple Heart.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Elvis and Mae Scott, brothers Jesse, Guy and Grady Scott, and a sister Margaret Scott Minton. He is

survived by his wife Grace Helms Scott ,his son, Tommy F. Scott sisters Hattie Scott Bass and Irene Scott Blackwell , numerous relatives and many friends.

Immediately after the school property, Ebenezer Church road is on the left. The road goes along the School property and through a rural residential/farming area (it's curvy, watch your speed). The Church and cemetery is on the right, about 2 miles from the highway.
